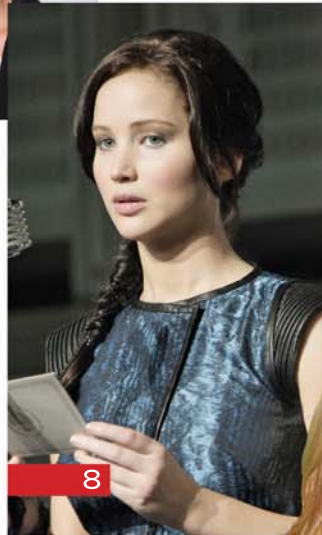

Stars at TIFF

The Toronto International Film Festival has become one of the most important film festivals in the world. Time magazine called it “the most influential film festival.” It has an annual attendance of over 500,000 and 10,000 films have been shown since it began in 1976. Numerous celebrities come north to show off their films, and this year is no exception. Chris Hemsworth, Daniel Radcliffe and Scarlett Johansson are audience favorites—here’s a look at their upcoming films, which will soon be available in theaters.

Chris Hemsworth’s

Rush debuts in theaters on September 27. In it, he plays real life British race car driver James Hunt, who faced off against another brilliant race car driver, Niki Lauda (Daniel Brühl) in pursuit of the 1976 World Championship held in Japan. It’s amazing how closely Hemsworth resembles Hunt, a hard-drinking playboy who died at 45 of a heart attack.

Okay, so *Thor: The Dark World* isn’t playing at the festival. But since we’re already talking about Chris Hemsworth, we thought we’d mention that the handsome Aussie returns to the role that made him famous. This time around, Thor forms an uneasy alliance with his adopted brother Loki (Tom Hiddleston) and reunites with Jane Foster (Natalie Portman) in an attempt to save Earth and all the Nine Realms from vengeful Dark Elf leader Malekith the Accursed.

stars in no less than three films screening at TIFF. *The F Word* is a comedy about being friends (The “F” in the title doesn’t mean what you think—it stands for “Friend”) when you want to be much more. Radcliffe stars opposite Zoe Kazan as his possible love interest. He’s also in *Horns*, a supernatural thriller about a man who sprouts horns on his head when he’s blamed for his longtime girlfriend’s rape and murder. His third

movie, *Kill Your Darlings*, takes place in the 1940s and follows the friendship of several Beat Generation writers—Allen Ginsberg (played by Radcliffe), Jack Kerouac (Jack Huston), William Burroughs (Ben Foster) and Lucien Carr (Dane DeHaan). When Carr’s sometime lover David Kammerer (Michael C. Hall) is murdered, they become suspects. The investigation winds up having a major impact on their careers and lives.

AT the end of *The Hunger Games*, Katniss and Peeta had become the first ever dual victors of the Games. They were thrust into a spotlight of fame and glamor that they had not previously experienced. Life imitated art for the young cast of the dystopian adventure, propelling lead actors Josh Hutcherson and Liam Hemsworth into the teen idol realm. That case was even more true for Jennifer Lawrence, who starred as Katniss. Since the success of the movie, the actress, now 23, became the second-youngest Best Actress Oscar winner for *Silver Linings Playbook*, establishing her title as Hollywood's new It Girl.

A look at two new stars of the popular series

"I'm just really starting to feel like a monkey in a zoo," Jennifer told *Vogue* magazine. "All of a sudden the world feels entitled to know everything about me." In *Catching Fire*, her character Katniss' life is also dramatically altered when she's thrust into the spotlight. She and Peeta have no other choice but to play the game of celebrity and be viewed as a public attraction in order to protect their loved ones. The question on everyone's mind is: "Who can you trust?" That's especially put to the test when a special

edition of the Hunger Games known as the Quarter Quell is announced, ordering all surviving past champions to return to the deadly arena.

In the second installment of the franchise, Jennifer shares the screen with two actors whom you may not yet have heard of—Sam Claflin and Jena Malone—but that's about to change with the release of *Catching Fire*.

Last year, the pair nabbed the two most coveted roles for every 20-something actor in Hollywood: Finnick Odair and Johanna Mason.

As the tall, sexy and tanned Finnick Odair, actor Sam Claflin, 27, is expected to have audiences swooning with desire and staring with envy at his muscled physique. The six-foot-two Brit emerged this decade with roles opposite A-Listers such as Johnny Depp in *Pirates of the Caribbean: On Stranger Tides* and Kristen Stewart in *Snow White & the Huntsman*. Despite having two blockbusters attached to his name, it's his role as District 4 victor Finnick Odair that should gain Sam fame.

Finnick became an instant star after becoming the youngest-ever winner of the *Hunger Games* at age 14. Years later, he's summoned back in the game as a mid-20s heartthrob who must compete against Katniss. Described as having sea-blue eyes and irresistible charm, it shouldn't be a surprise that Katniss herself is subject to Finnick's flirtatious demeanor.

"Finnick is this tanned, green-eyed, sex god. I'm thinking I'm brunette. I have loads of stubble, at the time I was by no means in shape," Sam told *Entertainment Weekly* magazine. "This guy walked in just after my audition who looked like Brad Pitt in *Thelma and Louise*. Yeah, I'm not going

to get this." Despite Sam's doubts, he managed to impress the filmmakers, landing a star-making role.

After four months of training, having his hair

died blond and his pale British skin spray tanned, Sam was ready to step in front of the cameras.

While Sam may be fairly new to the acting business, Jena Malone is a veteran at the young age of 28. She first made a name in Hollywood at the age of 13 in *Stepmom*, opposite Julia Roberts. Although she's been working steadily through the years in films such as *Saved!* and *Pride & Prejudice*, the role of the tough-as-nails District 7 victor Johanna Mason will definitely raise her star power.

In the books, Johanna constantly butts heads with Katniss, so a ferocious actress was needed to intimidate Jennifer Lawrence on screen. Countless actresses auditioned for the role, but it was Jena who brought the necessary intensity to nab the part. At Comic-Con in San Diego this year, Jena gave a hint about what to expect from the newest film, saying, "All bets are off. From where the last film left you, you're like, 'Oh, maybe there's some semblance of safety.' It's a whole new chapter."

Although Sam and Jena's characters have the potential to grab some of the spotlight, Jennifer Lawrence is not prepared to let anyone steal her thunder. She has two new films coming out in which she reunites with her *Silver Linings Playbook* co-star Bradley Cooper—*Serena* and *American Hustle*. She's also recreated her role as Raven in a new *X-Men* movie—*X-Men: Days of Future Past*.

There may be a lot of expectation built up for *Catching Fire*, but Jennifer promises fans will not be disappointed. "This movie is visually kind of huge and stunning," she teased at Comic-Con. "We dive a little deeper into the Capitol. We're back into Katniss' life as she's trying to kind of piece her life together after the game. The stakes are a lot higher."

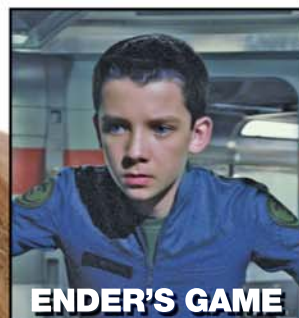

Carrie

Chloë Grace Moretz has played a girl haunted by demons, a foul-mouthed vigilante, a centuries-old child vampire and even a werewolf. In the remake *Carrie*, she takes on the iconic titular character.

It's been 37 years since the original film adaption of Stephen King's horror novel debuted, starring Sissy Spacek as the bullied girl with powers. It went on to become a cult classic and made the name Carrie White as unforgettable as its bloody prom scene.

For Chloë, stepping into Carrie's shoes came with pressure. "Everyone was always asking, 'Well, are you going to live up to Sissy's character, are you going to live up to the original movie,'" she explained at New York's Comic Con. "I've just got to think about it like any other movie, you know—just a movie with a script you love and it's a character you love that you really want to get into. You've just got to be completely confident in what you're doing, otherwise you'll tear yourself apart."

The story follows shy high school student Carrie, who discovers she has telekinetic powers. As someone who doesn't fit in, she's targeted by her classmates and constantly bullied. She finally uses her newly-found powers to get revenge on the people who tormented her.

Carrie's (Chloë Grace Moretz) deeply religious mother (Julianne Moore) tries to help her.

Chloë promises thrill seekers jaw-dropping, scream-eliciting, jump-out-of-your-seat scenes in the film and reassures fans of the classic horror novel that the new adaptation is even better than past screen versions, including the 1999 sequel and the 2002 TV movie.

Sissy Spacek was 27 when she played Carrie in the original film. Chloë faced the much different challenge of having to play an older character. "In the audition process [director] Kim [Peirce] was like, 'Okay let's see if she can be older.' Because I'm only 15 playing a 17 to 18-year-old, so she's like, 'Let's see if you can play older and embody that character.'"

Though her resumé is impressive and already exceeds those of actors twice her age, Chloë's career is just beginning. Last year, she called Toronto home while filming *Carrie* and *Kick-Ass 2* back-to-back. We hope to see her return to Canada to film more blockbusters in the future.

Ender's Game

While most of the highly anticipated young adult book-to-film adaptations were published within the last decade, Orson Scott Card's science fiction novel *Ender's Game* was first released almost 30 years ago.

Ender's Game follows the story of Ender Wiggin, 12, a shy but brilliant boy who's chosen to lead the military into a war against an invading race of aliens that will determine the future of Earth and the human race. Bringing the lovable characters off the page and onto the big screen are Asa Butterfield

and Hailee Steinfeld. They're joined by an ensemble cast including Harrison Ford, Ben Kingsley, Viola Davis and Abigail Breslin.

"I've never had an experience where there's a book that's had such an incredible fan base and it's sort of nerve-wracking but at the same time so thrilling to be able to

Not new to the world of film adaptations, having previously taken on the title role in *Hugo*, Asa said during a panel at Comic-Con: "Having a novel to revert to is always helpful. As an actor the amount of resources and things you can gain just by reading the story as well as the script is something incredible."

Hailee, who earned an Oscar nomination for her role in *True Grit*, describes her character in *Ender's Game* as very strong and independent. "My character is one of the only few girls in Battle School and the only girl in the army that she's in. She's constantly working to earn respect from the guys around her and I think when she meets Ender there's this really truthful connection between the two of them that comes from finding their way, finding their place."

While some might dismiss *Ender's Game* as another sci-fi adventure film for kids, Asa told *Entertainment Weekly* there's a lot more to it. "There are a lot of really important themes—leadership, bullying, compassion—and Ender is an intriguing, complex character."

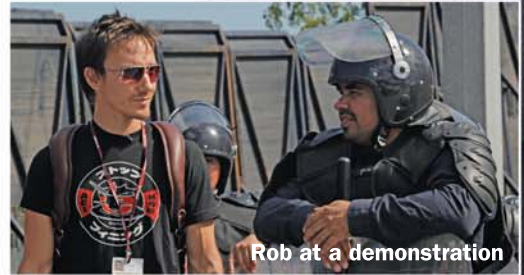

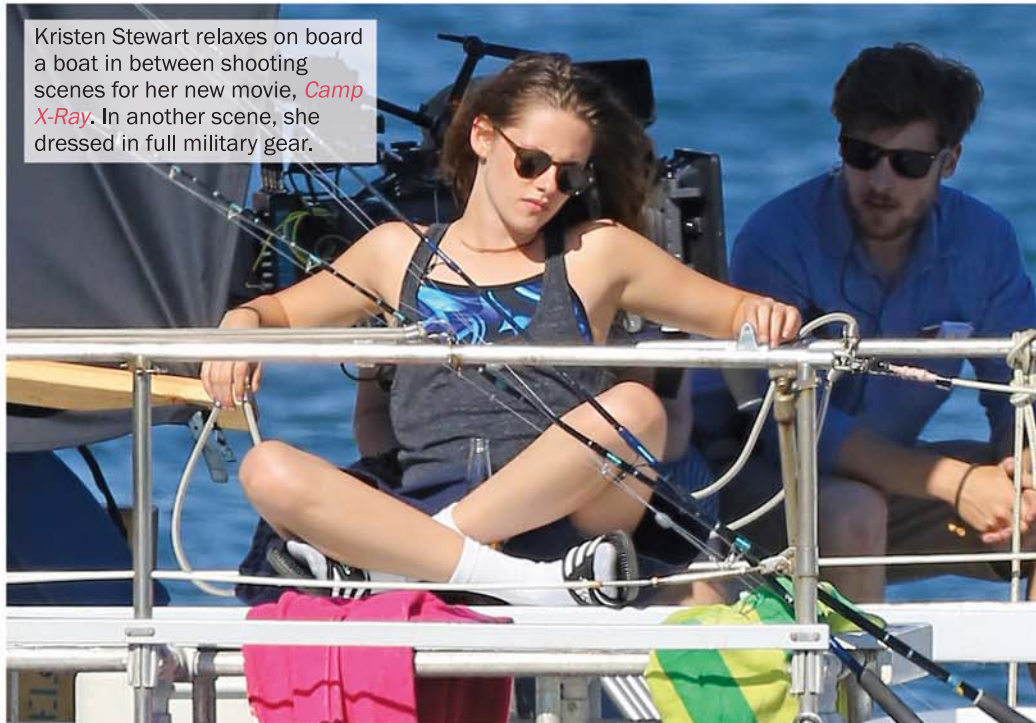

Megan Park, who starred as Grace in the ABC Family series *The Secret Life of an American Teenager*, was chosen as one of the Toronto International Film Festival's Rising Stars this year. She plays a role in *The F Word* with Daniel Radcliffe, which is screening at the festival. She spoke to *Tribute* by phone from Los Angeles, where she's playing a teenage alien on the TV series *The Neighbors*.

■ How did you feel when you found out you'd been named a TIFF Rising Star?

I was really excited because I've never been a part of TIFF before—*The F Word* is my first film to screen there. Also, I think it's such an amazing program for young Canadian actors not only to be a part of the festival, but to learn something as well.

■ Will you be going to TIFF?

Absolutely. The TIFF Rising Star program sets up a bunch of things for us to be a part of throughout the festival and on top of that we get passes to see films, which is so cool because what inspires us as artists to continue making stuff is to see other people's art.

■ Where did you film *The F Word*?

In Toronto and it was amazing because I hadn't shot anything in Toronto in years because I've been working on *The Secret Life of an American Teenager* in Los Angeles. So not only was it amazing to be back and get to experience the city again but we had such an amazing time filming it—it didn't feel like work.

■ Can you tell us about the film?

I would be such a fan of this movie, regardless if I was in it or not—it's totally my vibe. It's about these young people, played by Zoe Kazan and Daniel Radcliffe, who are in relationships, but they meet each other and there's this undeniable chemistry, so they fall into the "Friend zone," which is what the title—*The F Word*—is a reference to. I play Zoe's younger sister, Dalia, who's dry and sarcastic and she's like, "If you guys are just going to be friends, I want

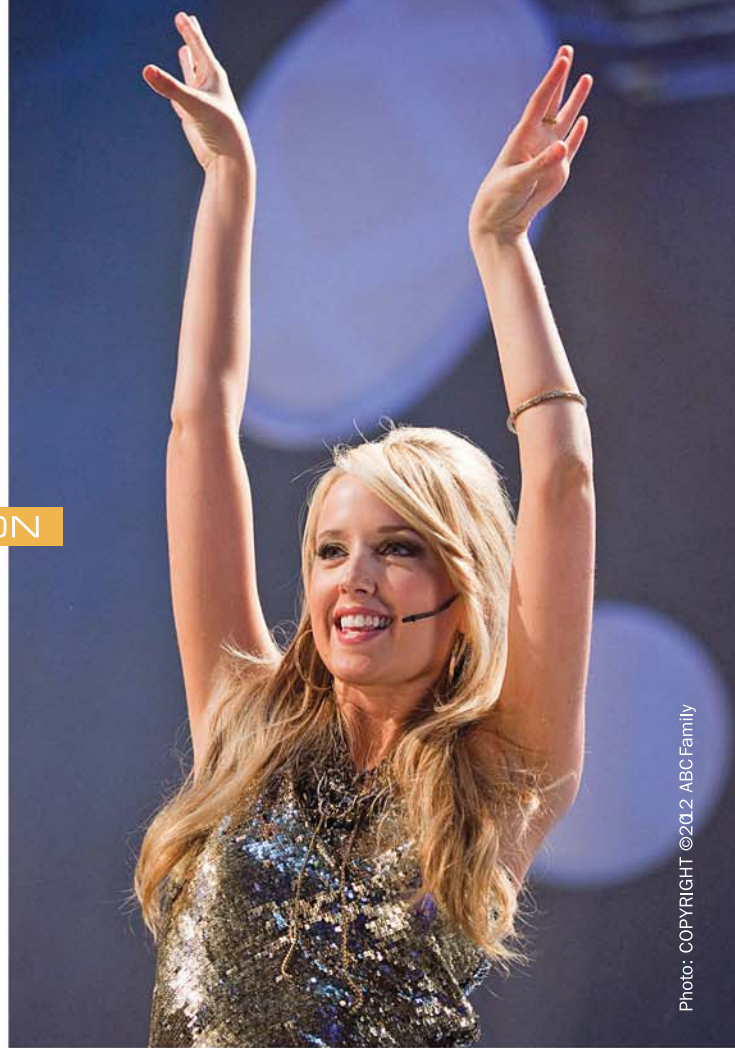

to date him." Ultimately, it's a story of love and friendship and what to do when you're stuck in the friend zone but you want it to be more.

■ What was it like working with Daniel?

Working with Daniel was literally such a pleasure. No ego—he's so dedicated and takes acting very seriously, but he's also playful and we got to improv a lot—he's very funny. I'd never seen him do a comedy before and he absolutely shines in this movie.

■ How did you get started?

I grew up in London, Ontario, where my family still lives. I started doing local theatre and I fell in love with it. Then I got an agent when I was in high school and worked in Canadian movies and TV shows and then I came to L.A. to audition for *The Secret Life of the American Teenager*. The show ran for five seasons and we just finished in December. Right now I'm working on an ABC TV show called *The Neighbors* and I have a couple of films coming up—I've been consistently busy ever since I found myself down here.

■ Is there anyone you'd like to work with?

So many people! I'd like to work with Sarah Polley, Sophia Coppola and Bradley Rust Gray—those are three directors I really want to work with.

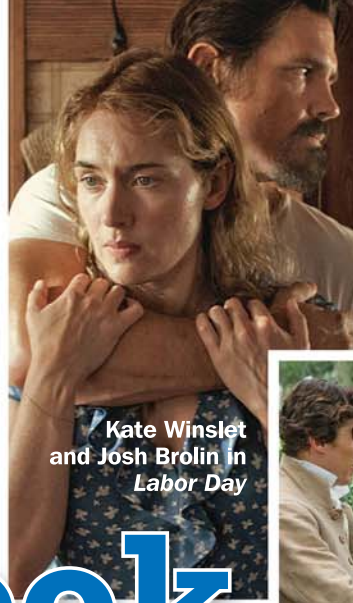
chronicles his time at a Japanese labor camp during World War II, where he was tortured as a prisoner of war.

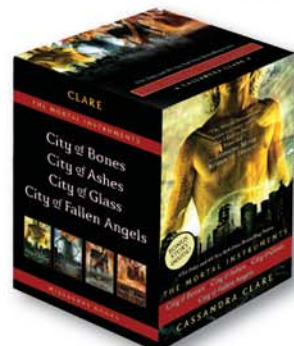

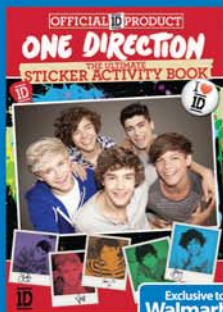

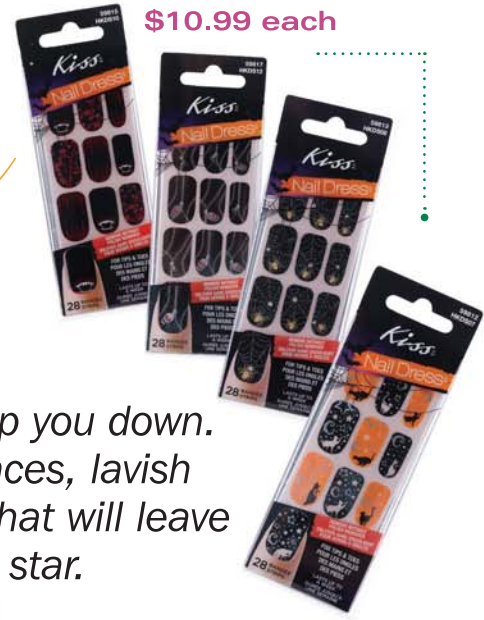
